We use research and clinic-based techniques to engage a child in playful context to improve a range of pro-social behaviors and build meaningful connections.

### Laying the Building Blocks

Achievements in language are key at almost every step in early development. Our team of professionals focus on communication, collaborative play, social interaction and imitation skills to give them the building blocks to learn.

### Individual Attention

With our 1:1 staffing and 20 to 30 hours a week of intervention, children get the personal attention they need to improve language and social skills allowing for richer learning experiences throughout their lives.

During his first month in the program, Elijah had limited verbal skills. Within the second month, he learned the word "help." Today, he can be found singing his heart out to the songs like: "head, shoulders, knees and toes" and "one, two, buckle my shoe."
